Protecting Yourself from THREE TYPES of BUSINESS FRAUD

In today's digital age, businesses face constant threats from scammers seeking to exploit vulnerabilities. Understanding these risks and implementing preventive measures is crucial to safeguarding your business.

There are three prevalent types of fraud that target businesses: business email compromise, check fraud, and internal fraud. Taking practical steps can minimize the possibility of falling victim to these types of fraud, and financial institutions can play a pivotal role in helping your business protect itself.

BUSINESS EMAIL COMPROMISE

One prevalent scam that businesses should be aware of is business email compromise (BEC). BEC is a specific type of phishing scam with the goal of financial gain, such as causing an illegitimate transfer of funds or payment of a fake invoice. BEC occurs when cybercriminals gain unauthorized access to a company's internal email system. Once inside, they can intercept and manipulate emails, often impersonating owners or key personnel within the organization to deceive others.

BEC can lead to fraudulent requests that pressure employees into making financial transactions. For example, a scammer may create a fake invoice that appears to be coming from a legitimate vendor and send it to an employee from the business owner's email address, instructing them to process the payment urgently. The scammer may even have access to the owner's calendar and will send it

at a time they know the owner is in meetings or unavailable, making it difficult for the recipient to seek clarification or confirmation.

Implementing robust protocols and educating employees can go a long way in avoiding business email compromise. Make strong, unique passwords required for all accounts, along with multi-factor verification if possible. Encourage employees to always verify financial or transaction requests with the supposed requestor and confirm any changes in account instructions, even when received from trusted vendors. Lack of communication internally is one of the main causes of scammers being able to take advantage of unsuspecting business owners. Regular audits and the establishment of a BEC response plan are also recommended. Collaborating with a financial institution that familiarizes itself with your business norms and transaction patterns can expedite action in case anything appears suspicious.



CHECK FRAUD

Another significant threat for businesses is check fraud, a scheme that often begins with the fraudulent use of business bank accounts. Businesses frequently issue checks, and with each check, they expose sensitive banking information. This makes routing and account numbers easily accessible to scammers, rendering businesses vulnerable to both check and ACH (Automated Clearing House) fraud.

While using checks is often necessary in business, it is crucial to take proactive steps to detect check fraud

as early as possible. Review your accounts daily, set up customized alerts with your financial institution, and ensure that extra check stock is securely locked.

Flagging unusual or unexpected transactions

for investigation can help you identify check fraud before it becomes a problem. Consider using services like Positive Pay, which helps you easily verify and reconcile the checks and ACH payments passing through your accounts. Dual control, which requires two or more authorized employees to collaborate on financial transactions, can also be beneficial in increasing oversight and detecting unauthorized transactions.

Business owners have a sense of trust with



their employees, but it is important to have internal controls in place to protect the business's assets. Many business owners believe such controls are not necessary because there are no signs that such a thing could occur, but employers never truly know everything about their employees and what they could be dealing with that leads them to commit fraud. Employers should have clear-cut policies and procedures in place, such as separation of duties for accounts payable, ordering supplies, and managing inventory levels. By not having duties separated and checks/balances in place, this puts your business at risk for loss.

Accounts payable should have one person reviewing invoices as they come in and approving for payment, then forwarding them on to a different person who enters in the payment information. If it is a new vendor, additional layers of approval should be in





place to confirm it is indeed a legitimate invoice. If this is not possible due to the size of your business, there should be checks and balances between the controller creating payments and the owner approving them and asking questions.

Business owners should also pay attention to their budgets to make sure nothing appears out of the ordinary or askew from budget projections. Anything that is off from what historical and projected numbers indicate should be reviewed in more detail to confirm its legitimacy.

Scams adapt and change quickly, so businesses must remain vigilant in the face of evolving scams. By implementing robust internal controls and leveraging the expertise and tools offered by your financial institution, you can significantly reduce the risk of falling victim to fraud. 

"The BBB Educational Foundation relies on support of donors, sponsors and events like this to provide free programs that teach consumers how to make wise decisions," says Lisa Frohnapfel, President and CEO of the Better Business Bureau in Western Michigan. "BBB is grateful to have such strong support from the community to continue promoting trust in our marketplace."

Industry Spotlight:

Revving up for New Technology Won't Slow Down Auto Repair

A piercing blue sky spotted with specks of gold as the leaves turn for the season. The crisp autumn air whisks past your window as you travel down a Michigan highway.



You're no longer moving, your car is dead.

It's a situation you never want to be in. Thankfully, your local auto repair shop is there to save the day. We rely on them for everything: transmissions, tires, fluids and oil changes. Even the occasional mystery repair when we're suddenly stopped on the side of the road.

Industries like auto repair have been around since the invention of vehicles, and as technology inside those vehicles changes, so must the repair shop.

The Christian Brothers
Automotive franchise has been
around for over 40 years. Kurt
Hein is the owner of two of those
repair shops in Grand Rapids. His
businesses have been Accredited
with the Better Business Bureau
for more than 10 years. Hein
knows firsthand, the industry is no
stranger to supply chain issues.

"They're just back orders or maybe the manufacturer has a run on a particular part that may be filled. They're just hard to get and it could be weeks, you know, before we are able to get it."

From a business standpoint, when the industry evolves, so must

the technicians. As cars become "smarter" and run on more technology, technicians must also learn the ins and outs of that technology. It's a factor Hein says makes finding quality talent more difficult.

"We're kind of in a specialized area. Technicians have to do programming and it's hard to get an individual with that talent level that also knows how to repair cars," says Hein. "I think it's probably going to be our biggest challenge going forward. I don't think cars break as much, but when they do, they require more complicated repairs."

One thing Hein isn't worried about, is keeping up with the new and advanced vehicle technology like the electric car.

"They still have suspensions, they still have things that need repair like brake parts," he says. "We have to adapt, and Christian Brothers kind of prides itself in trying to be able to do just about any repair."

It's no secret automobiles are more efficient than they were in the past. With more efficient



"With all that technology, the engine, the vehicle, and the transmission, the cost to repair them has gone up because it's more complex," says Hein.

With all of the changes in the industry, one factor remains the same for Hein. That is the value of trust.

"We're certainly not perfect, but we stand behind what we do. And I think the BBB is similar to that. They make sure that, in their accreditation, they want companies that will stand behind their work," says Hein. "I think customers are looking for a relationship and they want to know companies that are going to take care of them."



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Want 5-Star Reviews? BE MORE than JUST GOOD at What You Do!

More so than ever, businesses rise and fall with the number of review stars they have online. Customer reviews have become a vital component of a company's reputation and success. But being

a good plumber, electrician, contractor etc... isn't enough for customers to want to share their good experiences. We all know unhappy customers are more likely than happy customers to leave a review. So what do businesses need to do to make an impression that will bring in those 5-star reviews?

The Better Business Bureau looked at positive reviews for the HVAC industry and found

"skill and knowledge" wasn't the most mentioned trait. "Affordability" came in sixth. So if it's not price and skill, what motivates customers to leave a good review? Your personal skills. It's about the relationship you build with the customer. Make no mistake, price and competence are important. They are both among the most likely reasons for negative reviews. But if you want a positive review when the job is done, you need to do more than just good work at a fair price.


Using the HVAC industry as an example, the BBB found the most cited trait used in positive reviews (41%) is Courtesy and Friendliness. Greet the customer with a smile. Make an introduction. Listen to what they need. Take your shoes off or cover them when coming into the house. These simple steps set the stage for a great experience the customer will want to share with others. The second most cited trait (29%) is Informativeness. Be knowledgeable, and let the customer know what is going on. Help them understand not just what you are doing, but why. This feeds directly into the impression that you have Skill and Knowledge about the job, which was the third most cited trait (26%). Speed and Punctuality were other important factors. No customer wants to wait. Be honest

about your timelines and be on time. All of these traits come in well ahead of Affordability, which was cited in just 14% of positive HVAC reviews. In the end, the price tag doesn't lead to more reviews;

it's the personal connection you and your team make with the customer. Not only do these relationships lead to more reviews, but more importantly, they lead to repeat business.

There is one other key element to bringing in 5-star reviews: you need to ask. Don't leave and hope the customer decides to leave you a review. Hope is not a plan. Find a system to ask for reviews from your happy

customers. There are a lot of options on the market, free and subscription, to help businesses encourage customer reviews. BBB Accredited Businesses have access to the Review Solution Platform for free as part of their Accreditation. Talk with your BBB Account Manager to learn more about this program. No matter what system works best for your business, building trust through excellent people skills can turn one-time customers into loyal clients and pave the way for a thriving business in a competitive market. 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
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
