TAKING CARE of MENTAL HEALTH

Stressors are taking its toll, not only on personal but work life.

People are faced with a constant barrage of challenges each day, and some of those challenges may elicit stress. The BBB in Western Michigan interviewed representatives from BBB Accredited Charity Wedgwood Christian Services about current mental health challenges and the best way for individuals to combat stressors.

To give some background, Wedgwood Christian Services, located at 3300 36th St. SE in Grand Rapids, is one of Michigan's most highly regarded mental health & behavioral health experts for helping hurting children, teens, families, and adults, and is dedicated to boldly taking on the toughest issues facing them today through residential care, counseling services, and community programs. Wedgwood provides a wide-range of social services to meet the needs of the community. Their comprehensive continuum of care is one of the largest among social services agencies in the state of Michigan and their mental health resources are open to any child, teen, family, or adult who are looking for help, regardless of beliefs.

They described stress as an emotional response caused by an external trigger whereas anxiety is defined by the experience of persistent excessive worry that won't go away even in the absence of a stressor.

According to the Mental Health Foundation, many things can cause stress including: relationships, finances, grief, and work/school. Even positive changes can lead to stress. Loneliness has become a leading cause of stress in more recent years with the social isolation that was brought on by the global pandemic. Individuals can manage stress through strategies likes practicing selfcare and mindfulness, exercising, getting enough sleep, laughing, positive self-talk, practicing deep breathing, and connecting with others.

In a recent study done by BetterUp, they identified that more than three quarters of U.S. workers suffer from some kind of stress in the workplace. Some of the major factors impacting work related stress were workload, lack of support, role ambiguity, toxic leadership, and no appreciation. It's important to find healthy coping mechanisms to overcome these stressors. For example, individuals can establish healthy work/life boundaries, practice self-care, and try to identify their triggers.

"COVID-19 has played a significant role in individual's mental health," they shared. "We know that trauma has a way of revealing itself over time. Since 2020, we have been experiencing a mental health tsunami that we are just beginning to understand the full breadth of." More recent studies show that 4 in 10 high school students experience persistent feelings of sadness and hopelessness. Minorities are especially at risk. For example, African American children are 2x more likely to die by suicide. As a result, 53% of caregivers are fairly or very concerned about their children's mental and emotional health.

There are even more sobering statistics: According to the CDC, 14% of young men and 30% of young girls have considered suicide. In fact, the second leading cause of death among youth - as young as 10 - is suicide. The CDC data shows that the suicide rate has risen by 16% from 2011 to 2022.

COVID-19 has also had a significant impact on the use of social media, with teens and adults, and even kids filling the interaction void online. Social media can be so enticing to kids and young adults because they are searching for community, a place where they are understood, and where they can openly talk about what they are dealing with.

Wedgwood Christian Services says parents can help alleviate some of that stress by:

- Providing guidance and oversight to social media use. Remind kids (and probably ourselves, too!) that most things on social media are oversimplified. It's also important to have conversations about what makes for a reliable, trusted source of information.
- Creating a space for them to have these conversations in real life whether that be with parents, teachers, or school guidance counselors, or with therapists. Having someone who knows the child and can understand the big picture and context is useful.
- Kids need to feel believed, capable, and safe. Even if you don't totally understand what your child is dealing with or feeling, approach the conversations with an open mind, curiosity to understand and be willing to learn more.
- Reach out to a mental health professional who can help your child navigate their challenges and support you as you parent them through this.

The world has become a much more challenging place in the past few years and Wedgwood Christian Services gives this advice, "When anxiety, depression, or other mental/emotional health concern presents as a barrier to the completion of day-to-day responsibilities, ability to have healthy interactions, or your ability to meet your own basic needs then it's time to seek help."

to ethics," says Lisa Frohnapfel, President and CEO of the Better Business Bureau in Western Michigan. "This year's winners and finalists put a great emphasis on these values and it is apparent in their work."

TEAM BOB'S HEATING, COOLING & PLUMBING

Empowering employees to be the one you can recommend

Investing in employees. That is how Team Bob's Heating, Cooling & Plumbing in Traverse City aims to live up to their tagline "The One You Can Recommend." The company has provided HVAC and plumbing services and installation in the area for over 40 years. President and Owner Charles King says the key to their success is creating a work environment that fosters employee growth, success and pride. He says that translates directly to how his employees interact with customers.



"What's always set us apart is, well, the way we started out the first day in business," says King. "We showed up when other people wouldn't. We're a service organization that shows up 24 hours a day, day or night."

King says training, communication and involvement in the community all help get employees invested in the company, and create trust among customers. King says his employees feel empowered to do the right thing out in the field.

"They go into people's personal private homes. If they find a situation in which there's a family, or there's an individual, who's doing everything they can, and they're in trouble, our employees are empowered to take care of the situation right then."

King says receiving an award by a third party like the BBB shows the company is on the right track.



CALDER CAPITAL

We are all a team and family

Calder Capital in Grand Rapids offers business evaluations, which are offered to buyers and sellers of businesses. They also represent sellers and buyers looking to make business acquisitions.

"Everything that we do and all the advice that we give and how we act is in the best interest of the client," says Managing Partner Max Friar. "We want clients to make decisions that we would make as people in their same position."

While the company handles business, it's all about family. That's something very important to Friar. He says his door is always open, and there is little sense of hierarchy. He says it is important to him that as the company continues to grow, that culture will be maintained not only for internal success, but external as well.

"We exist in an industry where there are unfortunately some short sighted actors and I think that to me it makes a big difference that this award recognizes that we're a long term thinking and planning company, and culturally the staff is very much aligned with that idea."

Redefining the contracting industry

Ayers Basement Systems will take basements and crawl spaces from dark, damp places to fully remodeled, finished and usable spaces. They also do foundation work, concrete repair, and even have subsidiary companies to help with electrical and plumbing needs.

The company demonstrates trust in their community by educating, advising and walking alongside people, according to CEO Zack Krieger. He says Ayers Basement Systems takes pride in investing in their employees so they can be the best versions of themselves.

"Developing a place where people feel safe at work, where

they're on fire for their job, where they really love to partner with the people that they work with and have a place where they can develop, grow, advance, and really just champion, that's like job one," says Krieger.

Krieger says the passion for the job bleeds into the work, creating excitement for customers because they get to see the results. He says this creates sustainability and lets Ayers Basement Systems keep doing what they're doing.

"At the end of the day, I think your actions speak louder than words," says Krieger. "If we're backing up what's in our purpose manual with the behavior that we show our employees, I think trust just naturally develops."

WEDGWOOD CHRISTIAN SERVICES

When it comes to helping West Michigan, there is no individual leadership. It is a community effort. Growing Problems for the UNLICENSED

From the random guy on Facebook who wants to help with your roof, to long-standing remodeling companies, a lot of unlicensed builders and companies have been flying under the radar. But there is a push to not only call these companies out, but protect consumers who have been harmed by these unlicensed builders.

A longstanding requirement for Better Business Bureau (BBB) Accreditation is that the company has the necessary competency licensing. In Michigan, this often means either a Residential Builders license, or a Maintenance and Alteration License with the appropriate classifications for the work being performed. The BBB also deals with a lot of mechanical contractor, plumbing, electrician licenses and more. We feel it is important that someone working on a consumer's home has not only demonstrated a basic competence, but has also followed the rules and law. If they cut this corner, what other corners are they willing to cut?

Every week the Better Business Bureau identifies or rejects companies that are operating without the necessary licensing. Per BBB policy, these companies are informed of the licensing requirements and encouraged to bring their company into compliance. Those that don't are identified on their BBB.org business profile with an alert to customers informing them that this particular company does not have the license needed for the work they perform. It's a warning that gives consumers a key piece of information about a business, and helps those that have the right licensing stand apart from those that don't.

Not surprisingly, many of these unlicensed companies also have complaints from consumers about poor quality or unfinished work. That's where an initiative from the State of Michigan steps in. Started in 2023 as a partnership between LARA and the Michigan Attorney General's Office, they are working to encourage licensing while getting consumers their money back. The program is called the Unlicensed Builders Pretrial Diversion Program. Consumer complaints are made to LARA, which verifies the builder is unlicensed. If they meet other criteria for the program, the information is passed on to the Michigan Attorney General's office. Eligible builders can avoid criminal charges by paying full restitution and quickly becoming licensed. Victims of unlicensed builders are encouraged to file complaints with the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs for swift action.

There is also an added financial risk for unlicensed builders. Michigan Court rulings have made it difficult for unlicensed builders to collect when a customer refuses to pay. They don't have the same access to traditional collection methods available to licensed builders, such as liens and lawsuits. Most times unlicensed builders are left hoping the consumer pays as planned or doesn't know their rights. Of course, all of this can be prevented by obtaining the correct licensing.

If you are a BBB Accredited Businesses, then we know you already have the correct license. For other businesses that aren't sure, you can check with LARA at michigan.gov/lara or reach out to the BBB. Elevate Your Digital Footprint: Unleashing Compliance Power in 2024

As we enter and settle into the new year, it's the time businesses are looking to tune and revamp their goals for an even stronger year. One of the biggest opportunities for any type of business is their digital advertising department. The beginning of the year is a perfect time to look over the company's website and social media to make sure it's in compliance with ethical advertising. To simplify this process we have put together a comprehensive checklist inspired by the Better Business Bureau's Code of Advertising:

1. Truthful and Transparent Messaging

- Check Claims Accuracy: Review all product or service claims on your website to ensure accuracy. Verify that you can substantiate any quantitative statements with evidence.
- Avoid Deceptive Tactics: Confirm that your website content does not use misleading imagery, headlines, or any other elements that may confuse consumers.

2. Clear Pricing

- Transparent Pricing: Review all pricing information to guarantee clarity. Include all applicable fees and charges, and avoid hidden costs.
- Crystal Clear Sale Terms: "Sale" claims require a substantial price cut below usual for a limited time (30 days max, with proof beyond that).

3. Protecting Consumer Privacy

- Privacy Policy Update: First of all, an e-Commerce business must make sure they have a visible Privacy Policy on their website. If you already have a Privacy Policy, ensure that your website's privacy policy is up-to-date and complies with current regulations.
- Security: Confirm your website is secured, especially if you are collecting sensitive information such as credit cards or social security numbers.

4. Clear and Conspicuous Disclosures & Guarantees

- Important Disclosures: Assess the visibility of important disclosures such as terms and conditions, pricing, and disclaimers. Ensure they are easily accessible and not hidden.
- Crystal Clear Guarantees & Warranties: Review that any guarantee and warranty claims clearly and conspicuously include a statement where the complete details of the warranty can be seen prior to sale such as written by the claim, linked to where to find more information on the website, or a phone number to call for more information.

5. Fair Competition Practices

- Ethical Comparisons: If your website includes comparisons with competitors, double-check that the information is accurate and fairly presented.
- Avoid Unsubstantiated Claims: Ensure that your business does not make unsubstantiated claims about competitors or their products.
