

2021 OVERVIEW

The Better Business Bureau Educational Foundation covered a lot of ground in 2021. With a focus on educating consumers and businesses, staff spent a lot of time on the road conducting presentations and meeting with those we serve. New members of the BBB team were trained to share our lessons through Scambusters and Fighting Financial Fraud, and both programs saw the number of participants grow. The Foundation worked with our community partners on webinars to help educate businesses on SBA loans and business scams. These partnerships with stakeholders, including the Michigan Attorney General's office, Federal Trade Commission, U.S. Small Business Administration, Michigan State Police and local businesses and chamber groups, help the Foundation complete its mission and helps raise awareness about the works being done in Western Michigan.



The Foundation continued its work with local charities, helping them meet best practices and demonstrate competency and trust to potential donors. The program created a number of templates and tools for charities, making the review process easier and helping them meet these important standards. As nonprofits opened their doors to in-person events the Foundation team was able to make the personal connections we were missing during the pandemic.

Our Trust Award event at LMCU Ballpark saw more than 100 attendees, and celebrated our Trust Award recipient, three scholarship winners and three businesses celebrating 50 years of BBB Accreditation.

Our Torch Award for Ethics was held in person in conjunction with the Economic Club of Grand Rapids, and celebrated nine local businesses and nonprofits that have shown a dedication to Trust and Ethics.

The Foundation has told all these stories and more through regular communication with consumers, businesses and nonprofits in our monthly newsletters and our quarterly BBB Beacon Magazine.



BBB SCAMBUSTERS®

2021 saw a record number of schools embracing the BBB Scambusters® program. Based on presentations created by BBB in Raleigh, North Carolina. The game show-style presentation presents teams of students with scenarios that may, or may not, be a scam. Students collaborate to decide if the example is real or a scam. Teams that select the correct answer get to roll a large die for points. The team with the most points at the end of the class wins. The interactive nature of this educational content has made it popular with both students and teachers. In 2021 the BBB Educational Foundation had three people trained to give these presentations, and put all of them to work. Thanks to the support of Lake Michigan Credit Union and our local schools this program will continue to grow and thrive.

BBB makes it fun with their presentation, allows a bit of competition and teaches very important topics to young adults- all in just 55 minutes. Highly recommend!





CHARITY REVIEW

The Better Business Bureau Educational Foundation works to promote trust and transparency in the western Michigan nonprofit sector. In connection with the Better Business Bureau's Wise Giving Alliance, the BBB Educational Foundation conducts free charity reviews. These reviews evaluate nonprofits on 20 different standards of charity accountability. Nonprofits that meet all 20 standards are recognized as Accredited Charities at bbb.org and give.org. Accredited Charities are given the additional option to participate in the Charity Seal Holder program, which provides additional benefits to the nonprofit.
