

A 2022 update to the 2020 BBB Government Impostors Scams Study found losses more than doubled, while frequency slowed since its peak in 2021.

Losses \$445 MILLION 2.5 x more than in 2020 Federal Trade Commission (FTC)

## Social Security impostor scams most reported, highest losses

reports by consumers mention Social Security with losses totaling \$500,000 in 2021. (BBB Scam Tracker™)



Fake law enforcement officer claims Social Security number used in crime; threatens arrest. Scammer offers a new Social Security number; tells victim to buy gift cards or cryptocurrency to move money to "safe" account.



Social Security Administration (SSA) is the most impersonated agency for past three years.

#### **BBB Tips for Staying Safe**

- Government agencies don't call people with threats or promises of money and don't take payment with a gift card, wire transfer or cryptocurrency.
- Scammers spoof legitimate phone numbers. Do not trust the phone numbers or click on any links in a text or email message from a purported government agency. Look up the agency's number online.
- Social Security numbers are never "suspended." The Social Security Administration will never threaten to arrest you because of an identity theft problem.
- The IRS generally makes its first contact with people by regular mail – not by phone – about taxes. Never provide your bank account or personal information to anyone who calls you claiming to be associated with the IRS.

- The grant is never received but scammers keep the money and personal information.
